Indicates what type of rule is being proposed. See chart below.

If "Yes" appears in this field, the rule has an "Adverse Impact" on business as defined in R.C. 107.52 and thus was submitted to the Common Sense Initiative Office (CSIO) for evaluation prior to its filing with JCARR.

If "Yes" appears in this field, the rule has been reviewed by the filing agency using the criteria outlined in R.C. 106.03 & 106.031 and the entire rule is subject to review. If "No" appears here, then only the changes the agency is making to the rule is subject to JCARR review. A new rule will be blank. A rule exempt from FYR will show "Exempt" in this section.

This field indicates what action the agency is taking on the rule. These actions can be Original Filing, Revised Filing, Refiled Filing, To be Refiled, Withdrawn filing, No Change, Final Filing or Withdrawn Final Filing.

This field shows the last day the rule is within JCARR's review jurisdiction. For rules that are filed as new, rescinded or amended rules, the jurisdiction ending date will be 65 days from the Original filing date or 30 days from the Refiling date. For No Change / R.C.106.03 /106.031 rules, the jurisdiction ending date is 90 days from the date filed with JCARR.

When a rule is Final Filed, an effective date is assigned by the agency. The effective date cannot be less than 10 days from the Final File date. A date will appear in this field when a rule is final filed or filed as an Emergency rule.

This field shows the title of the rule as given by the filing agency.

Rule Types

Amendment - The rule is being proposed by the agency with changes to the currently existing rule.

New Rule - The rule is a new rule meaning that the language/content of the rule is new.

Rescinded - The rule is being rescinded by the agency.

No Change - The rule is being filed with no changes. The agency has reviewed the rule pursuant to the criteria set forth in R.C. 106.03 and R.C.106.031 and has found that the rule should be filed without change.
