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Background: The U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services (HHS) adopted [45 CFR 1321.11](#) to require each state's government unit on aging to *develop policies governing all aspects of [Older Americans Act] programs*. As a result, ODA developed policies to govern the area agencies on aging and ombudsman programs.

Since Senate Bill 221 became law, ODA completed an extensive review of its policies and has or will incorporate all remaining policies into the grant agreements with the area agencies on aging to comply with state and federal requirements. (See table below.) ODA does not propose to restate any of these policies into rules.
